OVERNIGHT PARKING PERMIT ORDINANCE
INFORMATION SHEET

\$100.00 PROCESSING FEE- *(Non-Refundable)*

\$50.00 YEARLY RENEWAL FEE *-(Non-Refundable)*

MUNICIPAL CODE SECTION 10.40.210. All Night Parking Prohibited.

No person shall stop, stand or park a vehicle on any street or alley within the City for a period of time longer than 30 minutes between the hours of 2:00 a.m. and 5:00 a.m. of any day.

MUNICIPAL CODE SECTION 10.40.210. Exception.

The provisions of this Section shall not apply to emergency vehicles or to vehicles for which a temporary or annual all night parking permit has been issued and is in effect.

MUNICIPAL CODE SECTION 10.40.220. Parking Permit.

Any person intending to stop, stand or park a vehicle on any street or alley within the City for a period of time longer than 30 minutes between the hours of 2:00 a.m. and 5:00 a.m. of any day may apply to the City Manager for a permit so to do in accordance with administrative procedures established by the City Manager in that regard. All administrative procedures and findings hereby shall be subject review by the City Council upon written request of any applicant who may be denied a parking permit as herein provided.

THESE ORDINANCES HAVE BEEN IN EXISTENCE IN THE CITY OF LA VERNE FOR MANY YEARS. STREETS LESS CROWDED WITH PARKED CARS ASSIST EMERGENCY PERSONNEL, SUCH AS PARAMEDICS, FIRE AND POLICE IN THE PERFORMANCE OF THEIR DUTIES.

The applicant must be a resident at the address on the application. Proof of residency is required. Prior to completing an application for a yearly parking permit, read this information sheet and application carefully. Be sure to answer all questions fully, using the back of the form if necessary. The Police and Fire Departments will review your application. An on-site inspection and possibly personal contact by the Police Department may be required.

The following are some, but not all, **REASONS** given for needing a permit **WHICH ARE NOT CONSIDERED VALID:**

1. The garage is being used for purposes other than parking vehicles. Use of garage to store furniture, business equipment, shop tools, etc. is not recognized as a valid need for parking vehicles on the street.
2. The driveway being used for storage of such items as unattached camper shells, trailers, and unregistered vehicles or being used for home business.
4. The garage and driveway are off an alley and resident dislikes parking there during hours of darkness.
5. Thefts from vehicle(s) parked to rear of residence.
6. Inconvenience of moving one vehicle from the driveway to remove another from the garage.

TEMPORARY PERMITS (not to exceed 15 days) :

1. A temporary permit will be issued once the Overnight Parking application has been received and the fee paid.
2. A temporary permit can be purchased for \$3.00 @ night by using the Overnight Parking machine located to the front of the Police Department.
3. These temporary permits can be used for overnight or vacationing guests; temporary mechanical problems (one night only); construction on driveway; for both automobiles and motor homes.

NOTE: A parking permit does not enable the recipient to “store” a vehicle legally on the street. Vehicles parked on the street without being driven for over 72 hours will be in violation of Vehicle Code Section 22652. (k) and may be stored.

TOW TRUCKS. Tow truck owners/operators who are subject to 24-hour call out for emergency road service or Police tows may be granted a permit under the following provisions:

- a) Applicant shall attach to the application, documentation of approval from neighbors on both sides of the applicant, directly across the street from applicant, and/or any other resident within 100 feet of the tow truck’s location.
- b) Applicant shall verify with a letter from their employer that they respond to emergency call outs and submit proof of insurance for the vehicle.

APPEAL PROCESS. Any person aggrieved by a decision of the Police Department may appeal such a decision pursuant to this code to the Hearing Officer (as designee of the City Manager) of the La Verne Police Department.
